

Covid-19 Response Plan

The intent of this plan is to summarise the Event Organisers response to the delivery of the Gentle Annie Bike Ride (The Event) in each Covid-19 Alert Levels and the steps that the event will undertake in its duty of care and the wellbeing of all those attending and to uphold the intent and guidelines directed by the NZ Government in this national health response.

The principals of this plan follow the <u>Cycling New Zealand Guidelines for the resumption of</u> <u>cycling events and organised cycling activity</u> in addition to the information provided on the official Covid-19 website here and the Sport NZ website here.

The principals of the Alert Level system that have been applied to this plan are below:

- Alert Level 1 Event is able to continue. Event should be vigilant in maintaining good hygiene practices to minimise the risk of community transmission.
- Alert Level 2 Event may be able to continue but gathering limits and other restrictions will apply.
- Alert Level 3 / 4 Event is unable to continue event will be cancelled. You are not permitted to travel or gather with people outside of your bubble.

The event recognises that the Delta variant has spread rapidly worldwide and is now the main variant in many countries, including NZ. It is the most transmissible variant, spreading a lot more easily than the original version of the COVID-19 virus and other variants and requires additional consideration.

The event also recognises that the Covid-19 situation is fluid and the government can make decisions that impact the event at any time. The Ministry of Health (MOH) website and updates will be monitored and reviewed when new information is released.

Details from this plan will be included in the events safety management plan.

The event is scheduled to take place between Taihape and Hastings, situation on Saturday 13 November, primarily based around the Napier Taihape Road. The event field is capped at 200people, and starts in Taihape at the Monument park and finishes in Hastings at Roosters Brewhouse. The event is significantly split up with finishers spread over 4-5 hours.

Spectators are actively discouraged from being on the course, as part of the traffic management policy. The Little Annie event has been cancelled to reduce the uncontrolled congregation of competitors and spectators at the Kuripapango aid station.

Riders who are unable to attend due to government restrictions or if the event is prohibiting their attendance will be offered a refund based on the 4 weeks cancellation policy.

80% refund if cancelled more than 4 weeks out from the event

25% refund if cancelled less than 4 weeks before the event, or if competitors unable to attend the event (Competitors will still receive ordered merchandize)
